124	<p>Public Session  PCSO Airey informed the Meeting that there has been no reported crime in the Village for the month of February. Wiseton had two crimes reported, the theft of a trailer from a locked compound and the theft of a van. There is current interest in a white Transit van, seen on peoples drives. It seems there is more activity of late in scrap metal items, presumably because of a rise in price, and residents are encouraged not to leave metal items on drives and in front gardens where they may attract unwanted interest.</p>
